



Oakwood University Dietetic Internship Program Curriculum

Oakwood University's dietetic internship is a post baccalaureate program that admits only interns who have completed the didactic program in dietetics requirements, and has at least a bachelor's degree. As of now, Oakwood's dietetic internship program has one concentration: Medical Nutrition Therapy (MNT). Each year twenty interns will be accepted into this program. The program requires 200 Foodservice Management hours, 240 Community Nutrition hours, 680 Clinical Nutrition hours, and 80 elective supervised practice experiences.

This internship program adopted the July 2008 ERA's for DI and organized it into three dietetic internship rotations.

1. Food Systems Management/Administrative Rotations Interns learning outcomes are based on the eligibility requirement and accreditation standards for dietetics programs.
 - a. DI 3.3, 3.4, 3.6, 3.7, 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 4.5, 4.6, 4.7, 4.8, 4.9, & 4.10
2. Community Rotations

3. Clinical Rotations
 - a. DI 1.1, 1.2, 1.3, 1.4, 1.5, 2.1, 2.2, 2.3, 2.4, 2.5, 2.6, 2.7, 2.8, 2.9, 2.11, 3.1, 3.1a, b, c, d, & 4.11
 - * Clinical rotations are further broken down into the following specialties.
 - Long term care
 - General medical
 - Oncology
 - Cardiac
 - Medical/Surgical
 - Pulmonary
 - Behavioral health/ Eating disorder
 - Pediatrics/OB
 - Renal inpatient/Outpatient
 - Nutrition support/ICU
4. Eighty supervised practice elective hours according to interns' preferences.
